**Project Name:** Wetland Restoration Partnership Projects

**Details:** The Minnesota Board of Water and Soil Resources (BWSR) is seeking to develop wetland credits through partnerships with landowners, local governments, and other entities to restore previously drained or filled wetlands. The credits generated by the wetland restoration project would be split between BWSR and the partner based on the terms of a partnership agreement. BWSR is requesting proposals from potential partners with sites located in the following Bank Service Areas (BSA): 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, and 9. This includes all or portions of the following counties: Aitkin, Anoka, Becker, Beltrami, Benton, Big Stone, Blue Earth, Brown, Carlton, Carver, Cass, Chippewa, Chisago, Clay, Clearwater, Cottonwood, Crow Wing, Dakota, Dodge, Douglas, Faribault, Fillmore, Freeborn, Goodhue, Grant, Hennepin, Houston, Hubbard, Isanti, Itasca, Jackson, Kanabec, Kandiyohi, Lac qui Parle, Le Sueur, Lincoln, Lyon, Mahnomen ,Martin, McLeod, Meeker, Mille Lacs, Morrison, Mower, Murray, Nicollet, Nobles, Norman, Olmsted, Otter Tail, Pine, Pipestone, Polk, Pope, Ramsey, Redwood, Renville, Rice, Scott, Sherburne, Sibley, St. Louis, Stearns, Steele, Stevens, Swift, Todd, Traverse, Wabasha, Wadena, Waseca, Washington, Watonwan, Wilkin, Winona, Wright, Yellow Medicine.

Partnership projects take advantage of the experience, capabilities, and technical resources of each partner. Respondents considering this option should be familiar with the wetland banking process and understand the technical and financial commitments associated with wetland banking as well as possess the financial means to support construction of a wetland banking project. For this RFP, BWSR has defined the partnership roles and responsibilities in the following manner.

- BWSR will be responsible for the planning, designing, and obtaining regulatory approval of the Mitigation Bank Plan under the Wetland Conservation Act and Section 404 of the Clean Water Act, obtaining a Section 404 permit (if necessary), and obtaining);
- Partners will be responsible for construction (including any other permits associated with construction), post-construction monitoring for a period five years, and preparing, submitting, and receiving approval of a final wetland delineation report. Alternative arrangements for completing the monitoring and final delineation will be considered.
- Partners may propose to take responsibility for vegetation establishment and management at the site or elect to have BWSR be responsible for this task.

Restoration projects will be evaluated using the following criteria. The percentage in parentheses is the contribution of the criterion towards the total score for the project:

Credit Yield (20%)
Technical Feasibility (20%)
Functional Benefit for the Watershed (10%)
Rare or Difficult to Replace Wetland Functions or Characteristics (10%)

Qualifications of the Applicant (10%) Cost per Credit (30%)
